# Appendix 2 - Arts & Culture Strategy 2021-2031 Delivery Action Plan for 2022-2025

This Action Plan sets out how Wandsworth Council plans to work in partnership with a range of organisations, community groups and residents to help deliver our shared vision of ensuring a strong and thriving arts and cultural offer that benefits not only individuals, but also families and wider communities, as well as contributing to the vitality of the Borough's neighbourhoods and town centres. Through collaboration with our cultural and creative practitioners, freelancers and organisations, we aim to animate our local economies, foster our strong sense of community ownership, raise aspirations, and support residents in leading healthy and happy lives.

The tables below collate the headline initiatives being developed and delivered either within the council or by organisations based or working in the borough. The tables are not comprehensive, especially for years 3 and 4, but set out the plans currently being developed, which may adapt/change depending on the results of year 2 and the changing environment.

Over the next ten years, through this strategy and accompanying rolling three year action plan, we set out our plans to work proactively with our partners to deliver our shared ambitions for Arts and Culture within the Borough, and our vision to establish Wandsworth as one of the country's leading examples of how to integrate cultural opportunities and engagement into the delivery of all the Council's priorities. Our ten year vision was ambitious and set for the whole borough, so no single organisation will be able to deliver it all – there are sections highlighted in green that the Council will lead on, such as creating the right policy frameworks, but there are many elements where the expertise lies with our partners, both the big and the small actors on the cultural stage, highlighted in yellow. Our focus through this action plan is to broker collaboration and partnerships in order to leverage all the unique cultural assets found in the borough.

### **Background information**

This three year rolling action plan, covering the three year period from April 2022 to March 2025, sets out how the Council, cultural organisations and community groups plan to work in partnership to ensure the delivery of the Arts and Culture Strategy 2021-31. The goals and objectives listed below are taken directly from the new strategy.
